"The exploitation, manipulation, or control of a person by violence or threats of violence, to provide a sexual service or to provide forced labour"

- 93% of Canada's trafficked victims come from Canada.
- According to Stats Canada, the most common form of human trafficking is sex trafficking and the average age is 13 or 14. More than 93% are female.

You can HELP!

Become Aware: Learn how traffickers lure their victims and what signs to look for that indicate someone is being trafficked. Ask NCM Canada for an Anti-Human Trafficking information kit or download it at www.ncmcanada.ca Help protect children and youth. Inform your church and community.

Pray: Pray for the victims. Their recovery is very difficult. Pray for healing and that they can be reintegrated into a loving home or independent living.
