The exploitation, manipulation, or control of a person by violence or threats of violence, to provide a sexual service or to provide forced labour.

CANADIAN STATISTICS

- 93% of Canada's trafficked victims come from Canada.
- According to Stats Canada, the most common form of human trafficking is sex trafficking and the average age is 13 or 14. More than 93% are female.

HOW YOU CAN HELP

BECOME AWARE

Learn how traffickers lure their victims and what signs to look for that indicate someone is being trafficked. Ask NCM Canada for an Anti Human Trafficking information kit or download it at www.ncmcanada.ca Help protect children and youth. Inform your church and community.

Pray for the victims. Their recovery is very difficult. Pray for healing and that they can be reintegrated into a loving home or independent living.
